


## A Report to the Office of the Commissioner on the Use of Performance Enhancers by Participants in the Henderson NCAA Tournament

Received March 10, 2008 Office of the Commissioner Henderson NCAA Tournament



On, at or about March 2, 2008 the Office of the Commissioner of the Henderson NCAA Tournament expressed interest in conducting a thorough, internal investigation into allegations of rampant performance enhancement use by participants in the Henderson NCAA Tournament.

The investigation commenced March 3, 2008 and involved the review of documents, expense and payment vouchers, previously sealed testimony and extensive interviews of and with participants in the Henderson NCAA Tournament.

Based on information uncovered in the investigation, this report is prepared to make the following findings and recommendations:


Approximately of participants have used performance enhancers within the past three years to elevate their performance in the Tournament;

Henderson NCAA Tournament Officials, including two high ranking officials identified as Matt and Pat had knowledge and or reason to suspect participant use of performance enhancers;

Tournament officials took no action to discourage, identify, test for or otherwise curb the use of performance enhancers;

One Tournament participant, identified in documents as "Carol served as a "dealer" of performance enhancers, operating out of a central office location to facilitate the performance enhancing needs of other Tournament participants.

The following individuals have been identified as having utilized performance enhancers to improve their results in the Henderson NCAA Tournament at least once over the past three years:





The Henderson NCAA Tournament should move aggressively to institute a mandatory testing and evaluation process to determine the full extent of the use of performance enhancers within the Tournament.
